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## Annual Performance Report (APR) Overview

Local Early Intervention Providers submit APR to New Mexico FIT Program State of New Mexico reviews local El Providers' APRs, compiles them and develops a statewide report to submit to OSEP

OSEP reviews State APRs, compiles results and submits a comprehensive report to Congress

#### What is an Annual Performance Report (APR)?

The federal Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) monitors states to ensure that early intervention services are provided in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Part C. As part of this monitoring process, states submit a 6 year "State Performance Plan (SPP)."

Yearly, each state reports on their progress toward meeting the indicator targets set in their SPP by submitting an "Annual Performance Report (APR)." Both the SPP and the APR can be found at <a href="https://www.fitprogram.org">www.fitprogram.org</a>

Additionally, in New Mexico each local early intervention provider agencies within the Family Infant Toddler (FIT) Program complete an Annual Performance Report, evaluating their own program's performance and submitting their results and improvement plan to the FIT Program.

#### Why are these indicators important?

The indicators chosen are cornerstones for ensuring that early intervention services are being provided in accordance with federal and state regulations; thus, ensuring that children and families receive high quality early intervention supports and services.

#### How will this information be used?

This information is used largely for quality improvement purposes and determining compliance with federal and state regulations. Through analyzing data, setting annual targets, and tracking progress, the state and local FIT Providers can identify the areas that need improvement and make concrete plans to address concerns and continue their successes.

#### How can I use this report?

You will find Information in this report about each early intervention provider in New Mexico, as well as the statewide performance related on each indicator. A link to a glossary of terms is also provided.

### The Indicators

Below is a list of the indicators reported by local early intervention provider agencies.

- Percent of infants and toddlers with IFSPs who receive the early intervention services on their IFSPs in a timely manner.
- 2. Percent of infants and toddlers with IFSPs who primarily receive early intervention services in the home or community-based settings.
- 3. Percent of infants and toddlers with IFSPs who demonstrate improved:
  - <u>Positive social-emotional skills</u> (including social relationships).
  - Acquisition and use of knowledge and skills (including early language/ communication); and
  - Use of appropriate behaviors to meet their needs.
- Percent of families participating in Part C who report that early intervention services have helped the family:
  - Know their rights.
  - ◆ Effectively communicate their children's needs; and

- Help their children develop and learn.
- 4. Percent of infants and toddlers' birth to 1 with IFSPs
- Percent of infants and toddlers' birth to 3 with IFSPs.
- Percent of eligible infants and toddlers with IFSPs for whom an evaluation and assessment and an initial IFSP meeting were conducted within Part C's 45-day timeline.
- 7. Percent of all children exiting Part C who received timely transition planning to support the child's transition to preschool and other appropriate community services by their third birthday including:
  - IFSPs with transition steps and services
  - Notification to LEA, if child is potentially eligible for Part B:
  - Transition conference if child is potentially eligible for Part B



## Indicator by Indicator: Statewide Results

Indicator 1: Infants and toddlers receive the early intervention services on their IFSPs in a timely manner.



"Timely" is defined as being within 30 days of the date of the IFSP (i.e., the date the parent provides consent for the IFSP services).

#### Why is this Important?

Child development research has shown that the rate of learning and development is most rapid in a child's first three years of life. Just as we try to identify infants and toddlers in need of intervention early, we try to get services started as soon after identification as possible. Because of this special period of readiness for learning,

In New Mexico, the percent of families who received all of the services on their IFSP "timely" was 95.4%.

The percent of families who primarily received their services in "natural environments" (Home and community settings) statewide was 99.28%

### Why is this important?

Early intervention activities are provided in settings where the child typically lives, learns, and plays in order to ensure that the activities become a part of the child and family's typical routines, such as mealtime, bath time, playtime etc. In this way the

## Indicator 3: Percent of infants and toddlers with IFSPs who demonstrate improved:

A. Positive social-emotional skills (including social relationships).

- Acquisition and use of knowledge and skills (including early language/ communication); and
- C. Use of appropriate behaviors to meet their needs.

Why is this Important?

Measurement of these functional outcomes will provide quantitative data demonstrating the benefits of early intervention for infants and toddlers.

In order to demonstrate whether a child has shown "improvement" in their development as a result of receiving early intervention it is necessary to measure the child's development against typical development for same age peers and to collect data from two points in time. The FIT Program uses of the national Early Childhood Outcomes (ECO) Summary Form, which is completed by the team utilizing developmental assessment information at the time of the initial IFSP; annually and when the child exits the FIT Program.

The following chart summarizes the results of the three outcomes for Indicator 3 for children being served for developmental delays and established conditions. The summary statements are as follows:

**Summary Statement 1:** Of those infants and toddlers who entered or exited early intervention below age expectation in each Outcome, the percent who substantially increased their rate of growth by the time they turned 3 years of age or exited the program.

**Summary Statement 2**: The percent of infants and toddlers who were functioning within age expectations in each Outcome by the time they turned 3 years of age or exited the program.

Indicator 4: Percent of families participating in Part C who report that early intervention services have helped the family:

- Know their rights.
- · Effectively communicate their children's needs; and
- · Help their children develop and learn.

The Family Outcomes Survey is distributed to families served through the FIT Program. Families can return the survey in a stamped addressed envelope or complete the survey online. The Family Outcomes Survey Tool was developed in collaboration with parents on the New Mexico - Interagency Coordinating Council (ICC).

930 surveys were received out of 3,079 surveys that were distributed. This represents a response rate of 30%.

#### Why is this Important?

One of the core values of the FIT Program is to be family centered - supporting the needs of the whole family, not just the child. Families are supported to advocate for their child, to know

#### Glossary of Terms

Assessment — An ongoing process including the use of tests and tools to identify your child's or family's needs and strengths.

**Consent** — Written permission or authorization that a family provides to proceed with an evaluation, services or to exchange personally identifiable information.

**Development** — The process of learning and mastering new skills over time; includes ability to move, communicate, think, see, hear, and play with toys or other people.

**Early Intervention** — A range of services provided by public and private agencies and mandated under law to support eligible children and their families in enhancing a child's potential growth and development from birth to age three.

Eligibility — Requirements your child must meet in order to receive early intervention services from the New Mexico Family Infant Toddler Program.

**Evaluation** — Determining your child's eligibility by gathering information about your child from records, assessments and using professional judgment.

FIT (Family Infant Toddler) Program — The program at the Department of Health that oversees the delivery of early intervention services in New Mexico through a network of public and private providers.

IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act) Part C- The federal legislation that

determines the implementation of early intervention by states.

**IFSP** (Individualized Family Service Plan) — A written plan for your child's and family's desired outcomes and services to meet those outcomes during your time in the FIT Program.

**IFSP Team** — A team that includes you, your Service Coordinator and other professionals involved in providing ongoing services to your family and anyone else you'd like included (i.e., other family members, childcare staff, pediatrician).

Intake — Your first meeting with your Service Coordinator, when he or she explains your rights, describes the FIT Program, and helps plan your child's evaluation.

Natural Environments — Settings that are natural or normal for the child's age peers who have no disabilities and include the home, childcare, and other community settings.

**OSEP (Office of Special Education Programs)** — The federal agency that oversees all state Part C programs. OSEP is dedicated to improving results for infants, toddlers, children, and youth with disabilities ages birth through 21 by providing leadership and financial support to assist states and local districts.

Outcomes — Statements of changes you want for your child and family that are documented in your IFSP.

**Parent** – Includes the biological parent(s), guardian, acting parent (including foster parents) or surrogate parent (assigned by the state in situations where there is no other person to act as parent at the IFSP).
