About the Family Engagement Survey

The annual Family Engagement and Satisfaction survey is a way for ECECD to hear directly from parents and caregivers.

Feedback will inform childhood programs and resources that address:

- Language accessibility, culturally diverse materials, and financial support
- Program availability in communities
- Access to programs for children with developmental delays and/or disabilities
- Overall awareness of programs

The survey is for parents and caregivers with young ones ages 0–5.

Survey Findings To Date

Facts + Stats

From our 2022 and 2023 surveys, we learned that:

- The demand for child care programs continues to exceed current availability.
 - Need has gone up by 8.4% due to inflation, recovery from the pandemic, and return to in-person work contributing to the increased need.
- Child care was the highest-rated need by all respondents in 2022, and remains so in 2023.
 - New Mexico has seen an 8% increase in program usage between 2022 and 2023.
- Child care is the most used program across New Mexico.
 - 2023 data sets show that 64% of respondents use child care.
- There is an increase in family well-being when child care programs are used.
 - 80% of respondents reported that using child care programs and services had a positive impact on their family.




